Junior Aston

Junior Aston is the Vice President of Governmental and Public Affairs for Atmos Energy and the Former vice president of marketing for Atmos' West Texas Division. Aston joined the predecessor to the Texas Division in 1991 as a marketing representative. He was named the division's first manager of public affairs in 1997 and was promoted to vice president of marketing in 2000. From 1980 to 1991, Aston was a petroleum land/permit agent in West Texas for Exxon Company, U.S.A. & earlier had worked as a manager in retailing.

Bobbie Barker

Bobbie J. Barker is Vice President of Administration for Texas Gas Service, a division of ONEOK, Inc. In this position, Barker is responsible for gas supply, safety and field audits, facilities, human resources and communications. Barker began her gas industry career in 1992 when she was named manager of mergers and acquisitions for Southern Union Company. When ONEOK purchased the Texas gas distribution properties of Southern Union in 2003, Barker was named divisional vice president; she was promoted to her current position in May 2003. Early in her career, she worked for the Texas Water Commission, the state's environmental agency, and the Legislative Budget Board. She earned a Bachelor's degree from the University of Texas and a master's degree in public administration from Texas State University. Barker is a board member and past president of the Austin Area Research Organization, the Downtown Austin Alliance, and the Austin Area Urban League. She serves on the advisory board of the Nature Conservancy, the advisory council of the University of Texas, School of Architecture, and is a City of Austin appointee to the Travis County Healthcare District.

Elaine Parrish, Moderator

Elaine Parrish is President and COO of CTN, The Energy Network, a subsidiary of Southern Gas Association. CTN provides timely, cost-efficient, and relevant learning opportunities to the energy industry. Elaine has extensive experience in the media, communications and entertainment industries where she has built and successfully run a wide spectrum of organizations. She has held senior executive posts with multinational corporations TV Guide, Spectravision and Warner Amex and with national television networks, Showtime, Sony's Game Show Network and Fox Family Channel. She has successfully pioneered new technologies for the video and television markets through two separate start-ups and has owned and operated an independent consulting practice where she provided strategic business consulting services. She holds a Bachelor of Science in Business and Public Administration from The University of Texas at Dallas and Coaching Certification from The Hudson Institute of Santa Barbara. She has served on the Boards of numerous cable television industry associations.

Jimmy Staton

Jimmy D. Staton is Sr. Vice President-Gas Delivery. He is responsible for all aspects of Dominion's gas delivery operations, including operations, planning, gas supply & system optimization for Dominion East Ohio, Dominion Hope and Dominion Peoples. He holds a bachelor's degree in petroleum engineering from Louisiana State University. He joined Consolidated Natural Gas in July 1993. He served as VP-Pricing, Planning & Financial Services for CNG Transmission Corp., the interstate pipeline and storage system in Clarksburg, W.Va., in 1997. He was named President-Asset Operations for CNG's regulated natural gas businesses Jan. 1, 1999, & was responsible for directing all the operating activities for pipeline & four local distribution subsidiaries. He was named senior vice president-Operations, Dominion Delivery, in 2004, & assumed his current position on March 20, 2006. Before joining CNG, Staton was Director-Rates for Arkla Energy Resources (now Reliant Gas Transmission). He also worked for the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission.
