Steve Beasley, Moderator

Stephen C. Beasley served as President of the El Paso Eastern Pipeline Group on the nine member El Paso Corporation Executive Committee. Responsibilities included Executive management (P&L) over \$8 Billion in natural gas pipeline and storage assets, including Tennessee Gas Pipeline Company (TGP), ANR Pipeline Company (ANR), Gasoductos de Chihuahua (El Paso's 50% interest joint venture with Pemex in Mexico), and El Paso's 50% joint venture interest with TransCanada in Great Lakes Transmission. Collectively, they provide natural gas transportation and storage services to gas utility, power generation, and industrial customers in 23 states and Mexico. Prior to El Paso, Steve was employed by Tenneco Energy (Acquired by El Paso), and FMC Corporation. Steve has been an active participant in leadership roles over the past 30 years within the industry, community, company and local charities – including acting as Chair and/or Co-Chair for El Paso's United Way Campaigns. He also served on the Board of the Southern Gas Association.

Arthur Corbin

Arthur Corbin is President and Chief Executive Officer of the Municipal Gas Authority of Georgia. He joined the Gas Authority in 1988 as Director, Gas Operations, was promoted to Vice President, Rates & Gas Supply in 1989 and was named President in August 1994. In January 2003, the title Chief Executive Officer was added. The Municipal Gas Authority of Georgia (the Gas Authority) is the largest non-profit natural gas joint action agency in the United States, serving 76 Member cities in Georgia, Alabama, Florida, Tennessee and Pennsylvania. The Gas Authority was formed in 1987 by an Act of the Georgia General Assembly to assist municipal Members that own and operate natural gas distribution systems. Arthur is active in various trade and industry organizations and currently serves on the Boards of the American Public Gas Association and the Southern Gas Association.

Paul D. Koonce

Paul D. Koonce is chief executive officer-Dominion Energy. In his current position, he oversees all of Dominion's natural gas related businesses. These businesses include the interstate pipeline and storage operations of Dominion Transmission and Cove Point LNG; the gas distribution operations of Dominion East Ohio and over one (1) Tcf of proved reserves through Dominion Exploration and Production. Dominion Energy also provides Appalachian producer aggregation, storage and transportation management activities through its Producer Services business. He has more than 25 years' experience in the energy marketplace with both regulated and unregulated responsibilities. Prior to the Dominion/CNG merger, he was president-Commercial Operations (Regulated Business) at CNG, and he previously served as SR VP, Portfolio Management at Dominion. He currently serves as chairman of the Southern Gas Association, and is immediate past chairman and current board member of the Interstate Natural Gas Association and Board member of the American Gas Association.

Dean S. Liollo

Dean Liollo is a native of Houston, Texas. He came to Mobile and EnergySouth in August of 2006 bringing with him 30 years of experience in the energy industry. EnergySouth is the parent company of several subsidiaries, including EnergySouth Midstream, Inc., and Mobile Gas Service Corporation. Dean is a 1983 graduate of Texas A&M University with a BS in Industrial Engineering. He also graduated from the Louisiana State University Executive Education Program. Dean is involved in several professional and civic organizations. He is Treasurer/Secretary, Southern Gas Association; incoming Director, American Gas Association; Chairman, Advisory Council, College of Industrial & Systems Engineering, Texas A&M University; Registered Professional Engineer, State of Texas; Director, United Way of Southwest Alabama and many other local organizations.
