Mr. Hereth has over 28 years experience in the energy industry. Mark has a master's degree in chemical engineering. He was a founder of Process Performance Improvement Consultants (P-PIC), a consulting firm specializing in energy pipelines formed in January 2003. He provided support to INGAA throughout the integrity management regulatory development process, and supported INGAA as well after promulgation of the regulation. He previously served as Sr. VP and General Manager of the Pipeline Consulting Business at Hartford Steam Boiler Inspection & Insurance Co. (HSB). He led HSB's involvement in supporting the Gas Research Institute (GRI) in demonstrating the applicability of risk management to improving pipeline safety and reliability. He subsequently led HSB's work in defining the technical foundation for broad-based integrity management programs and supporting development of technical standards within ASME, API and NACE. Mark served in a variety of managerial and technical roles in Radian Corporation, an HSB subsidiary for 13 years. Mark served on the adjunct faculty at the Northwestern University Transportation Center. He is a member of the AIChE, ASME and NACE. He serves on the Board and was a member of the Executive Committee of the INGAA.
